The event is set in the heart of Western agriculture, home of the frontier spirit that inspires everyone to keep pedaling toward the next adventure.

"Our sister tour, Ride The Rockies, gives cyclists plenty of alpine challenges in western Colorado, but Pedal The Plains provides a unique opportunity for riders of all ages and experience levels to enjoy the friendly atmosphere and sun-drenched terrain of Colorado's plains," said Tour Director Renee Wheelock.
